The BHHS Legacy Foundation Board of Directors and staff are proud to present its 2004 Community Grant Funding Report. This report serves to inform the community about the community grant funding accomplishments and commitments of the Foundation and its Affiliates.

Enhancing the quality of life and health of those we serve is our mission. In 2004 we awarded 90 grants totaling \$2,856,455 benefiting the communities in the greater Phoenix and Bullhead City/Laughlin regions. Since 2001, more than \$10,000,000 in grant funding has been provided to support community health and health-related issues and organizations.

The Foundation and its Affiliates support programs and organizations that focus on the development and improvement of community health, education, prevention, and healthcare access for children, families, and seniors. The mission also includes building collaborative relationships with other organizations which together enable them to provide more robust financial and leadership resources and technical assistance for the community.

The grantmaking process identifies and focuses on community health and other health-related unmet needs and issues in underserved and vulnerable populations. Assistance is also provided to build the capacity of nonprofit organizations in order for them to better serve the community.

This report contains brief summaries of the grants the Foundation and its Affiliates have funded in 2004. The grants are grouped by the four funding priority areas, which include:

- Increase and improve community access to healthcare.
- Improve community health through prevention, education, and awareness.
- Develop and expand Arizona's healthcare workforce.
- Strengthen and support community efforts that impact health and related issues and organizations.

The Foundation salutes the many community organizations and individuals who strive daily to improve the lives of children, families, and seniors.

The Foundation strives for excellence in giving as we build our legacy of caring, healing, hope, and outreach within our communities.
